



### A Letter From Josh Stoxen

**Executive Director** 

Weaving community with creativity and compassion: this has been the heartbeat of Woven Oak since we took our first steps toward becoming a nonprofit in 2011. As we enter our 10th year of pursuing this mission, we find ourselves in a crisis of community. A global pandemic and a bruising political season have exacerbated isolation and division in our communities in tragic ways. Fear and anger have dominated many of our social interactions, especially online.

2020 was a challenging year for Woven Oak as well. We lost our beloved Director, Angela Pancella, who relocated back to St. Louis. In addition, Friday Fun Life and Norwood Grows have ended as ongoing programs. The Norwood Makers' Collective and Norwood Connection were cut off from many of the relationships they had cultivated, and Baby Bear was also forced to reduce their in-person activities.

Yet, despite these challenges, there have been many signs of hope and new life. Baby Bear adapted, hosting outdoor events and providing delivery of goods to mothers and families in need. Norwood Makers made hundreds of cloth masks and found creative ways to support each other, including providing childcare for an aspiring chef in their midst. Norwood Connection continued to stay in touch with school counselors about the needs of families in Norwood schools. In August, Woven Oak adopted the Zion Food Pantry and began building connections with those in need of food. We also brought on two new student workers from Xavier University, who helped provide administrative and social media support, while also redesigning our entire Web site. In November, in partnership with a local company and Norwood churches, we were able to help distribute 300 Thanksgiving meals.

As we look to the year ahead, we recognize that the challenges are immense, yet we believe that our work is more important than ever. We definitely cannot do it alone, so thank you for your continued support, and may you find ways to weave community right where you are!

#### **Our Mission**

Woven Oak is an umbrella for many Social Services in Norwood. We are a community development center with programs spread across the city of Norwood.

Our focus is weaving human connections through our initiatives which provide basic needs to the people of our community.

#### What's In a Name?

Norwood has a population density of over 6,000 people per square mile, making it one of the most densely populated areas in Hamilton County. Despite that, it is easy for people to be lonely, disconnected from their neighbors, and completely unaware of the needs of those around them.

As oak trees grow, they start deep in the soil with a taproot, which represents our deep love for our community. As they grow, they develop an extensive horizontal root system, which expands to find moisture and sustenance, allowing the trees to survive. When Oak trees are planted close to each other, they can even share root systems that have grafted together.

We are like those tree roots, reaching out to our neighbors, and weaving them into the fabric of our lives, both of us receiving sustenance as we connect and develop relationships together. Relationships that enrich our lives and bring us from a place of survival to a place where we can flourish and grow.

### **Our History**

Woven Oak started in 2011 by offering a rugby program for kids who didn't connect with traditional sports. Our small, intramural, neighborhood team was an enormous success and inspired us to grow and expand our outreach to more underserved sectors of the Norwood community. Since then, Woven Oak has grown to include over five different programs that aim to develop a sense of community and support for those in need.




